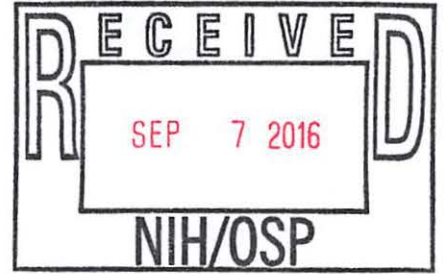

To The National Institutes of Health :

We write this letter to insist that the NIH continue its moratorium on funding research that involves injecting human embryonic stem cells into animal embryos.

These experiments are ethically problematic for many reasons:

1) Humans must be killed in the embryonic stage. 2) The entity produced could have partly or substantially human brains, or have human cells involved in their development to such a degree that they - these animals - become another ethical problem.

These experiments violate animal welfare as well as human welfare. They would violate the obvious good of species differentiation. To date there is no documentation of discussion by NIH the ethical issues involved! It is never acceptable to do evil, that good may come of it.

We must ask in ~~what~~ way the proposed research would differ from the Nazi medical experiments, albeit at a (micro)cellular level.
